At the end of the month, as Owenians returned to the village, a number of them came with mild to severe cases of illness. The corona virus had found its way into Owena.

In October, we were once again in Goroka for Judy's follow-up doctor appointment and to shop for needed supplies. However, because of the surge in corona virus cases in our province and talk of a lockdown, we came to town earlier than planned. A week and a half after arriving in town, we both came down with the virus. We were so thankful for a quiet place where we could quarantine and have undisturbed time to recuperate. We praise the Lord for His healing hand upon our bodies.

Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning. James 1:17 It is now November. We are still in town, waiting for Judy's medicine to arrive from Australia. As we wait, we rest, work on ministry projects, and do a little shopping. We praise the Lord for opportunities to give out tracts at a little market just outside of town. (The big market is closed until the end of the lockdown.) Have also given a number of tracts to David, an Owena man now living in town, who has many chances to share the gospel with fellow employees.

Back in Owena, the virus continues to make its rounds. Ta'ita's (Mike's wife's) mother and an elderly

lady recently passed away after being ill.

Amos and Nehemiah have been able to do public preaching in the village of Marivo, while Amos, Mike, and Dallas, are still being given opportunities to preach at LIBC.

- 6) Pray for much-needed rain. The Owena people's food supply is running short because they have been unable to plant new gardens as the ground is too dry and hard for digging.
- 7) Pray for the many souls who still need to be saved and for more opportunities for outreach and public preaching of the gospel. Our earnest desire is to see lives changed by the preaching of the cross.
- 8) Pray that we'll soon be able to start the new session of Soldiers of Christ Missionary School.
- 9) And last but not least, pray for laborers to reap the harvest, for it is great and the laborers are few. The time is short, and the Lord's return is at hand. Many will be forever lost if we are not faithful.
